NEWS FROM THE BOARD

A bid for installing 3 extra rigging pipes was received from the contractor who installed the original pipes and is familiar with the problems that would be encountered. The extra pipes could cut the cost of construction on each production significantly, and would allow greater flexibility with scenery and special lighting, as well as making installation of lighting and scenery safer and easier. The project could only be done during the summer months, as the stage area would be out of commission for 4–6 weeks. This is an expensive undertaking, so it would require a fund raiser. The matter is still under discussion by the Board.

The heater in the workshop will need to be replaced by next winter. The cost would be approximately \$1,000 for both heater and installation.

Linda McConchie, Jay Newlon and Jill Henderson together will be planning the opening night receptions for both *CABARET* and *TO KILL A MOCKINGBIRD*.

DID YOU KNOW?

The Footlight Club in Jamaica Plain claims to be the oldest community theater in America. But since they date from 1877, the claim may only be to operating under the same name. The Concord Players trace their history to 1856 and the Concord Dramatic Union, which Louisa May Alcott helped to found. In 1872, the Union became the Concord Dramatic Club, and in 1919, The Concord Players.

In 1921, the Players added the stage with fly space, scene dock, storage facilities, and green room to the town-owned building at 51 Walden Street, then used also as an armory. In 1972, the Players joined with the Concord Orchestra and the Concord Band to form the Friends of the Performing Arts in Concord (FOPAC), and the town of Concord agreed to allow this organization to refurbish 51 Walden as a performing arts center, which includes a music stage for the band and orchestra and a ballet studio.
