NEWS FROM THE BOARD

Representatives of the The Concord Players met with those of Emerson Umbrella to discuss how the two organizations can complement each other's artistic endeavors, and work together to bring a larger variety of choices to the community.

The board decided that in case of inclement weather during the run of *Cabaret*, the producers will decide on cancellation in the event of a blizzard. The producers will notify the webmaster to post the cancellation on the Players website, and will post a message on the Concord Players telephone (978-369-2990) two hours before the show is to open.

The Board is considering adding a second matinee to the schedule of performances of *To Kill a Mockingbird*. Audition dates have been set. Still looking for a publicity person to help with the show. The Concord Players have not decided yet if they will participate in the EMACT Festival in June. This decision was tabled for later consideration.

The proposal for installing extra rigging pipes for the stage has been tabled until a fund raiser is in place and The Concord Players can expect to raise 50% of the cost. The finance committee recommended soliciting other quotes.

The Nominating Committee has finished Board member selection for the Annual Meeting vote.
